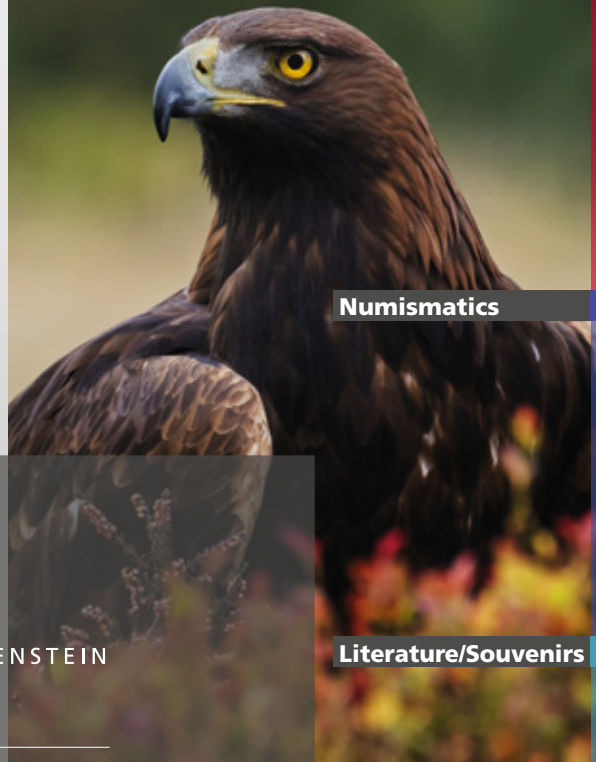

Information

The Principality of Liechtenstein marks its 300th anniversary on 23 January 2019. Through the special stamp “300 Years of Liechtenstein” (face value: CHF 6.30), Philately Liechtenstein will be making an exclusive contribution to this historic occasion. For the first time in history, it will be issuing an embroidered stamp. The anniversary stamp is self-adhesive and is presented in the shape of a Princely hat. It was made by the embroidery firm Hämmerle & Vogel in Lustenau, Austria.

In 1719, Emperor Karl VI united lands owned by Prince Hans Adam I of Liechtenstein, i.e. the county

of Vaduz and the dominion of Schellenberg, and elevated them to form the Principality of Liechtenstein. A ditch called the “Scheidgraben” is located between the two parts of the country which are today divided into the highland part (“Oberland”) and the lowland part (“Unterland”). This is where the residents of all eleven municipalities of the country will meet to march together and celebrate the unification in 1719 on the jubilee day, which is also the issue date of this special stamp. At the same time, this occasion marks the beginning of numerous activities in the jubilee year which will reach their peak on the date of the national holiday on 15 August 2019.

A limited special edition of the embroidered anniversary stamp will appear in addition to the regular stamp issue. The special issue is embroidered with a 24-carat real gold thread and adorned with eight original Swarovski crystals. Real gold thread has never been used for an embroidered stamp to date which means this special issue is a genuine world-first! Each stamp will be delivered in a high-quality case with a certificate of authenticity. The sales price is CHF 300.00.

To ensure that all our customers have the same opportunity of receiving this rare issue which is strictly limited to 2019 units, the orders received by **11 January 2019** will be collected and the issues will be allocated by drawing lots.

"National Bird" is this year's theme of the Europa stamps issued by PostEurop, the trade association of European public postal operators. As Liechtenstein does not have a national bird of its own, Philately has decided to depict the impressive golden eagle and is presenting it with the two motifs "Golden Eagle Approaching" and "Golden Eagle on the Lookout" (face value: CHF 1.50 each) as a combined print on a small sheet of 10 stamps.

Owing to Liechtenstein's small size and the home range of around 50 square kilometres that a golden

eagle maintains, the country only has a few pairs of these birds of prey. The king of the air as the bird is also often called has dark brown feathers with a lighter golden brown head and neck. It has a wingspan of more than two metres and its prey includes mammals, birds and carrion. Golden eagles usually live in the open space of mountains above the tree line but in the winter it will also forage for prey in lower regions. A pair of golden eagles has different eyries that they alternate in using for their broods. In contrast to other birds, the voice of the golden eagle is rarely heard.

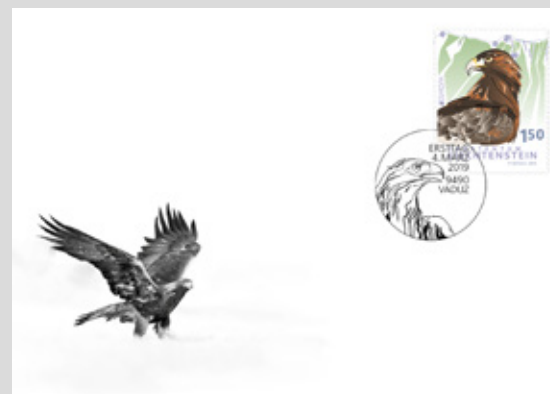

The special stamp "Vienna and Bern" (face value: CHF 2.20) focuses on the theme of the diplomatic missions of Liechtenstein set up in Switzerland and Austria in 1919 for the first time.

Lawyer Emil Beck (1888-1973) was the representative at the Liechtenstein legation in Bern until 1933. He played a part in various state treaty negotiations between both countries. According to parliamentary records, the closure of the diplomatic mission in Switzerland was attributed to the country's financial situation. Prince Eduard of Liechtenstein (1872-1951) was also a legal scholar and represented Liechtenstein's

interests from 1919 to 1921 as an envoy in Vienna. At the time, the aim was to get Liechtenstein out of the difficult situation it found itself in as a result of the First World War and to ensure that the country was recognised as being neutral and independent. Today, Liechtenstein has eight diplomatic missions in Berlin, Bern, Brussels, Geneva, New York, Strasbourg, Washington and Vienna and is also represented at the Holy See. Liechtenstein citizens can contact Swiss embassies on consular matters in all the countries where Liechtenstein has no diplomatic mission of its own.

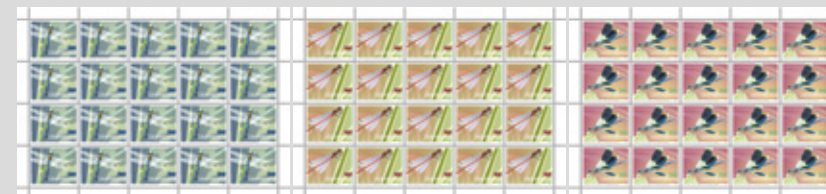
Four magnificent dragonflies adorn the new issue of self-adhesive definitives: "Beautiful Demoiselle" (face value: CHF 0.85), "Blue Emperor" (face value: CHF 1.00), "Large Red Damselfly" (face value: CHF 1.80) and "Banded Demoiselle" (value: CHF 2.60). Nature photographer Xaver Roser caught these insects on camera.

All the depicted dragonflies are indigenous to the Ruggeller Riet nature reserve. The biocenoses of the fens found there also include numerous endangered plant and animal species which fortunately do not

include the four dragonflies shown. Dragonflies count among the most important bioindicators. They say a lot about the quality of the waters and wetlands. Their four wings, each of which operate independently and combined weigh at most one centigramme, are unique. Large dragonflies can fly at a speed of more than forty kilometres per hour without backwind, accelerate extremely quickly, stop abruptly in full flight or suddenly change direction. In contrast, the exceptional manoeuvrability of small dragonflies in tight spaces is impressive to watch.

Stamp-dispensing machines decommissioned in Liechtenstein

It is the end of an era – On 31 October 2018, the last stamp machine in Liechtenstein was sent into its well-deserved retirement. For decades, the machines were available at post offices throughout Liechtenstein and stamps could be purchased in all common face values around the clock.

As demand declined but the same amount of maintenance was required, the machines were gradually decommissioned in recent years. The last machine at Vaduz post office has now also been taken out of operation. As a reminder of the dispensing machine stamps, a special cover will be issued bearing the postmark of the last date of use (31.10.2018). You will find these on page 15 of this brochure.



The last stamp dispenser of Liechtenstein was decommissioned on 31 October 2018.
